"Our girls have never been started with a gun in their lives before," and Springtok coarn Alexander R. Builley yesterday.

"In all our national champion-ships the start is by word of mouth. In the sprints the gun start may put our girls at a disadvantage, but I'm not making excuses."

Mr. Builey said other factors which would count against his team were the facts that they were not used to wimming in a 55-yard pool, but in shorter pools, and that Hazel Holmes, of Durban, will swim for the first time in fresh water.
