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AUST. GETS ANOTHER GAMES GOLD MEDAL

VANCOUVER, Wed.—Australia yesterday won another Empire Games'

gold medal, and two minor-place medals.

Sydney's 15-years-old swimming stars Lorraine Crapp and Gary Chapman set new records in their 440 yards freestyle heats.

Miss Crapp's time, 5 min. 17.9 sec., bettered by 5.5 sec. the record established in an earlier heat by Maggie Petzer (S. Africa).

Chapman's winning time of 4 min. 47.8 sec. bettered the Games' record by 1.5 sec.

But his record was short-lived—in the

following heat John Wardrop (Scotland) won in 7 secs. faster.

Australia's Marjorie Jackson is ending her brilliant career with a final burst of glory.

Yesterday she "strolled across the line" to win her heat of the 220 yards sprint in 24.3 sec.—equalling the Games record.

Experts tip her to break her world record of 24 sec. if she is extended in the final tomorrow.

Hogan qualifies

Fellow-Australian Winsome Cripps also won her heat in the 220 sprint in 24.7 sec.

Australian Hector Hogan, after winning his 220 yards sprint heat, finished third in

heat, finished third in his semi-final, qualifying for the final tomorrow.

Australia suffered a defeat in the rowing when Peter Evatt was beaten by S. P. Rand (Eng.) in the single sculls.

However, the Australian crew easily won its heat in the four-oar with cox, defeating New Zealand.
